



Possible Partnership Activities

Teacher to teacher or student to student communications via email or letter or Skype

Video Conferencing by pre arrangement with BEFSA

Share School Improvement Plans to identify common areas of interest and to develop joint working

Seek ways to bring together the work of those UK students participating in the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme with their South African counterparts involved in the President's Award

Create an International News Page in your School Newsletter to share information about your activities with your partner school

Create an International Notice board in the school to raise awareness and to celebrate the partnership activities

Use the School Council to drive the partnership and to support the partnership coordinator at the school

Identify one class or year group to link with a class in your partner school

Share information and resources on different school activities/curriculum areas e.g. global citizenship, music, art, dance and drama, heritage and tourism, literature and poetry, compare cultures, religions, history, local geography, poverty, HIV/Aids, sharing ideas on food and nutrition, swapping recipes and ideas for the creation of vegetable gardens

Fund raising to support the partnership

UK schools sending any redundant school equipment (but still in clean working order!) to SA partner schools e.g. sports equipment, musical instruments, computers (BEFSA will co-ordinate the shipping of such items)

Hold a "South Africa" evening for parents and the community to raise awareness

Use Facebook and Twitter as a communication tool for students and staff

Exchange visits for teachers and students
